

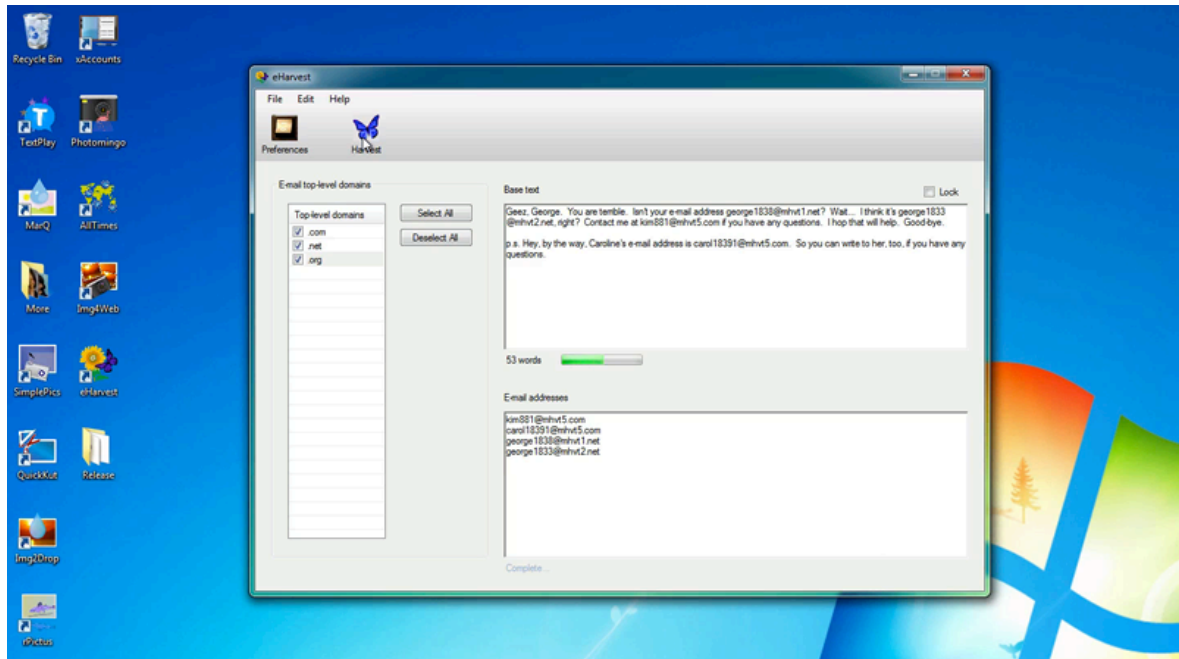
# eHarvest



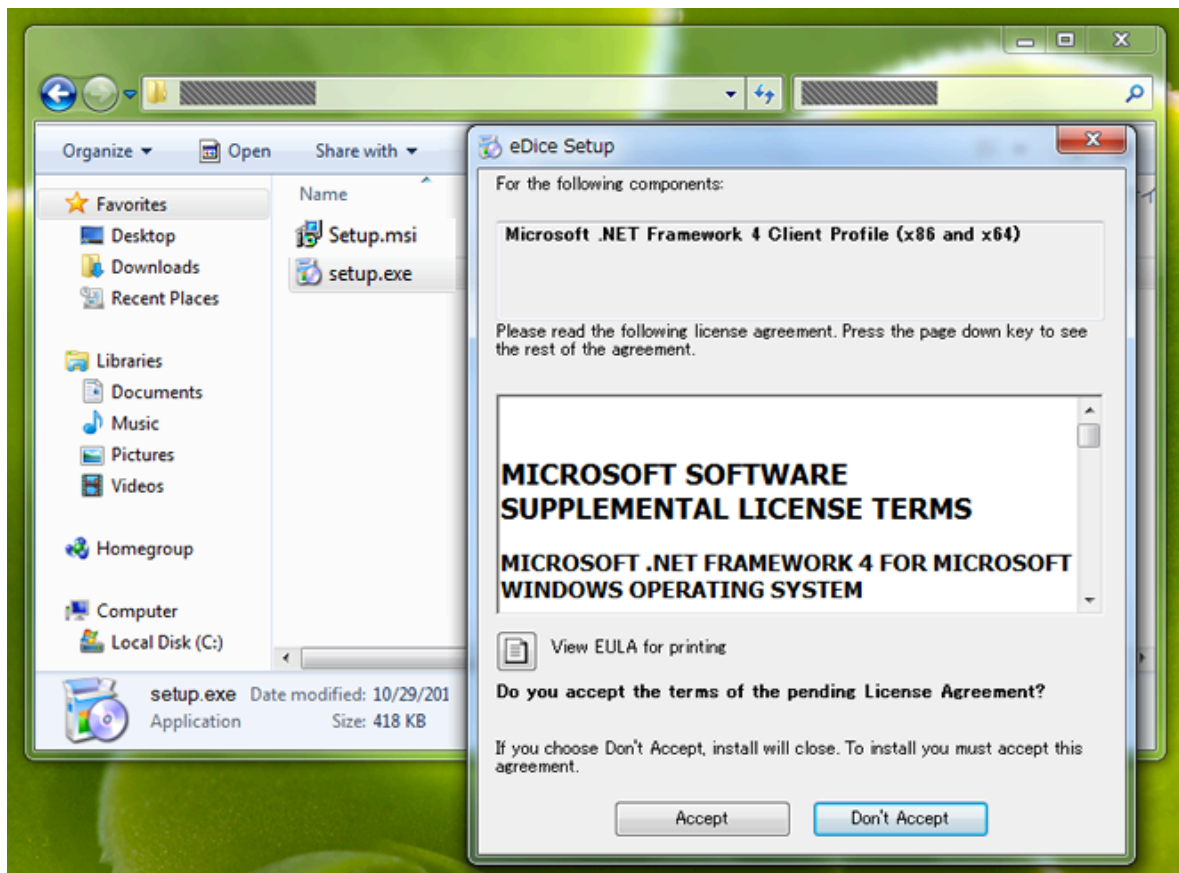

## 1. Introduction

**eHarvest** is a quick solution to extracting e-mail addresses from a body of text. Simply, choose File > Open to open a text file or drag and drop a selection of text onto the top text field. Then select one or more top-level domains from the list. If original text contains one or more possible e-mail addresses, the Harvest button on the toolbar menu will become accessible. So just click it away.



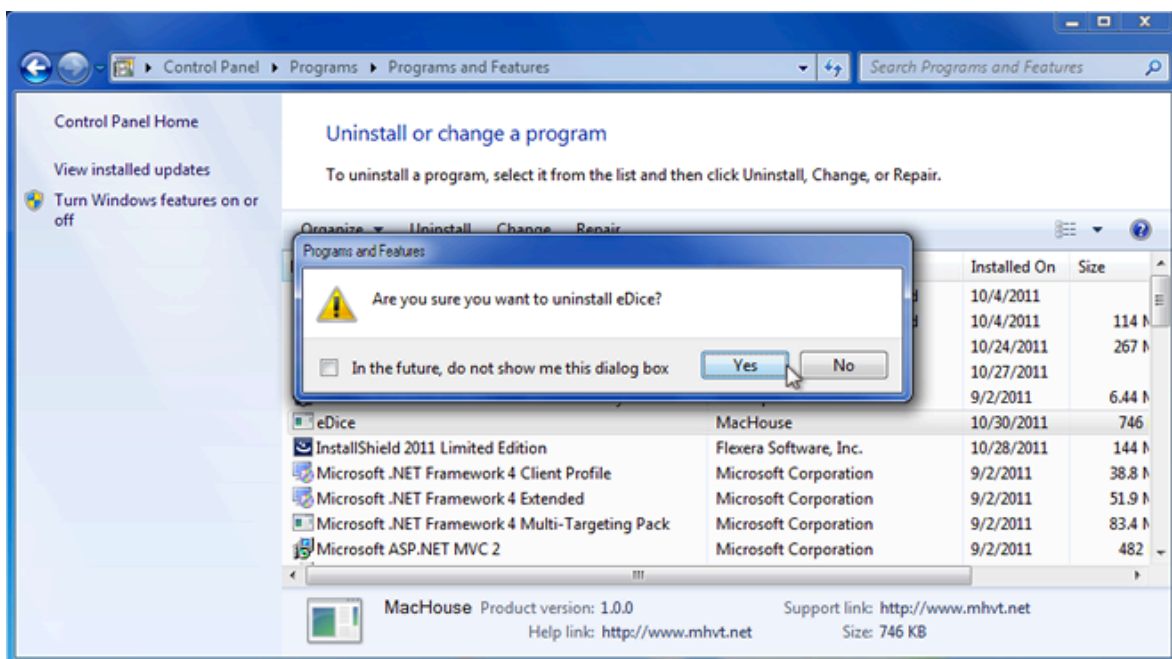

## 2. Installing eHarvest

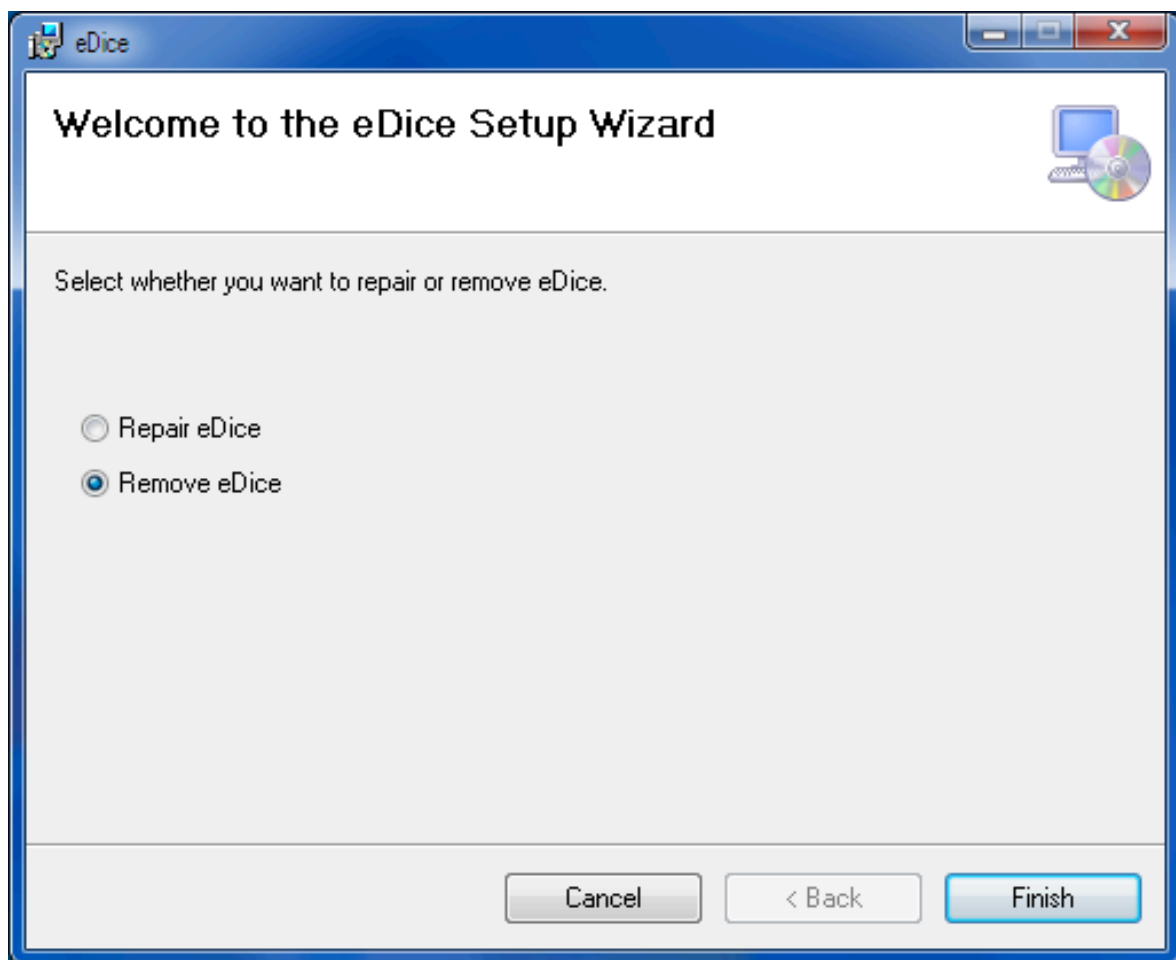
Double-click on **setup.exe** in the delivery package initiate the installation process. If your computer doesn't have it yet, eHarvest will first attempt to install **.NET Framework 4**, and you will be prompted for confirmation. (See Screenshot 2.) Then you will proceed to install eHarvest. You can use **Setup.msi** to install the application as long as you already have .NET Framework 4, which eHarvest requires. You can find the application at the following path: C:\Program Files\MacHouse\eharvest.

## 3. Uninstalling eHarvest

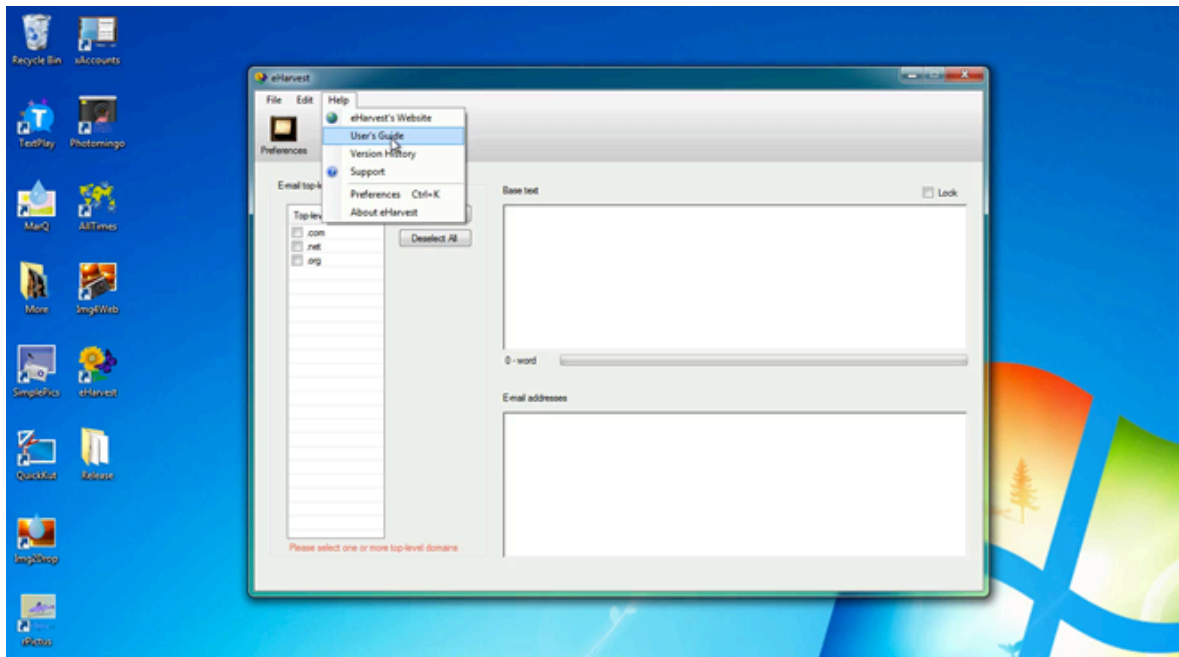
Open Control Panel and choose Uninstall a program. Then double-click on eHarvest to initiate the uninstalling process. (See Screenshot 3.) You can also use the original setup.exe or setup.msi to uninstall the application. (See Screenshot 4.) Additionally, when it starts up for the first time, the application will create a folder, which you need to manually trash. You can locate it easily by opening Preferences and navigate to the System tab.
