inp02 Wizard Edition Quick Start

About this Document

This **Quick Start** is designed to show you the basics of working with **inp02 Wizard Edition**, so you can be imposing PDF files in Acrobat within minutes. The document covers how to use the Wizard interface, adjust various marks, preview and output. Advanced information can be found in the **inp02 User Manual** which is installed in the Acrobat Plug-in's folder (select **Help > inp02 Help** under the inp02 menu).

Prior to start the following exercise, inp02 Wizard Edition should be installed and running in your Acrobat's plug-in folder.

If you are working with the **Demo version**, no output will be allowed until the product is purchased and activated. **inp02 Wizard Edition** can be solely purchased online at <http://store.dynagram.com>.

You will note that some menu items are disabled (greyed out) in the application. These functions can be unlocked by purchasing inp02 advanced modules. You can contact sales@dynagram.com for more information.

Workflow Overview

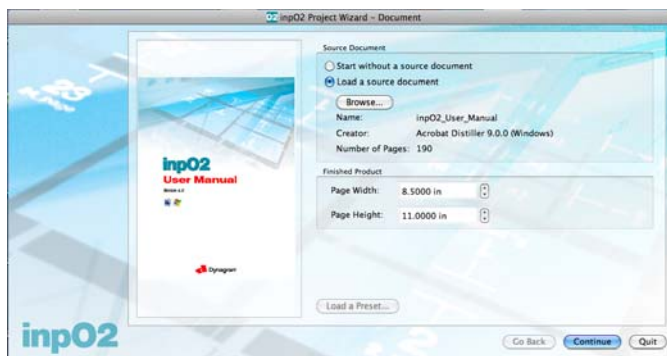
inp02 Wizard imposes **single PDF file** documents containing pages of the same size. If your imposition job contains more than one PDF file, you can merge them into a single document using Acrobat.

A new Wizard job is started by going to **File > Create inp02 > Wizard....** The Wizard will walk you through the steps to imposing your print ready PDF document.

When exiting the Wizard, the job can be previewed in Acrobat using different view profiles. Then the PDF imposition is output to a device folder.

Creating a Job with the Wizard

This exercise will walk you through creating a new job using inp02 Wizard. For this exercise, we suggest you to use the **inp02 User Manual** PDF document, which is readily available within Acrobat. To open the PDF file, click on **Help > inp02 Help** under the **inp02** menu.



Select **Create inp02 > Wizard** from the Acrobat's **File** menu. This will bring up the Wizard.

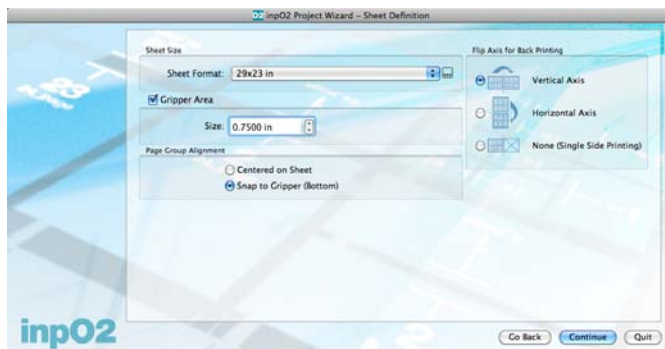
Panel 1: Document The active PDF document will automatically load and a preview will be shown in the first panel. inp02 will also extract the number of pages and trim page size from the document.

Click **Next** to continue to the next panel of the Wizard.



Panel 2: Project Type Select **Saddle-Stitch** for Project Type. Note there are other types of jobs available including Perfect Bound, Step and Repeat, and other common projects.

Click **Next** to continue.

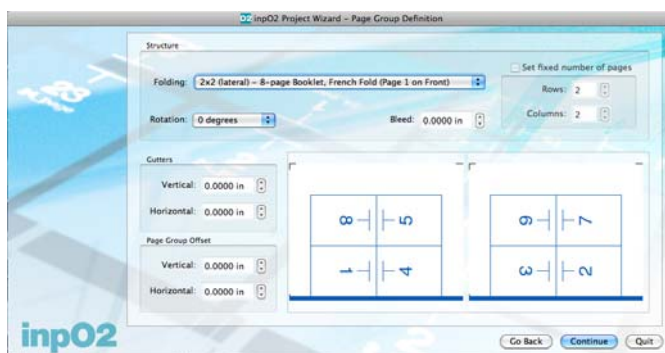


Panel 3: Sheet Definition Select the 29x23 in. format in the **Sheet Format** drop list. Note that more sheet presets can be created. This will be explained later in the document.

Select **Vertical Axis** as the flip axis for back printing. Note: if you select “No Mirror” you will be creating a one sided layout.

Select **Gripper Area** and enter .75 inches for your press gripper allowance at to the bottom of the sheet. Ensure that the **Snap to gripper** option is selected for the page group alignment.

Click **Next** to continue.



Panel 4: Page Group Definition Click on the **Folding** drop list and select one of the two **2x2 (lateral)** folding templates from the list. Leave the rotation to 0 degrees. Foldings determine the page head orientation and numbering sequence of the basic imposition layout. They will combine with the binding type to create all the signatures needed to complete the job.

For **Gutters**, leave the Horizontal Gutter to “0” and set the Vertical Gutter to “.5” inches.

Click **Next** to continue.



Panel 5: Marks Select the marks you desire for the job. Experiment marks in the different tab panels. The Wizard validates the layout and informs you when there is an overlap. You can always go back to the previous panel and offset the page group vertically or horizontally to allow for marks placement.

Click **Next** to continue.



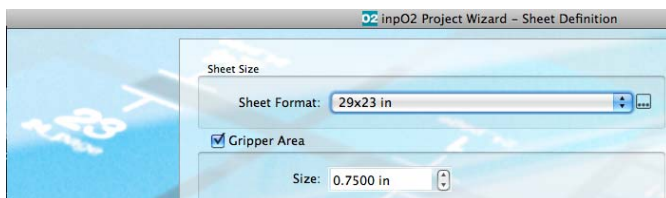
Panel 6: Finalization Note the summary of the job: number of sheets produced, total pages, size and added blank pages (if any).

To avoid an excessive number of blank pages to fill the sheet, you may always select the “Work and Turn” option that will apply only if necessary. Open the **Work and Turn Signature** drop menu and choose the **Last** signature of the job. inp02 Wizard will automatically reduce the number of blank pages needed to complete the job by creating two half signatures on the last sheet.

Select the **Creep Compensation** option and enter a value of 0.012 inches. This adjustment will push the pages progressively inward to compensate for the paper thickness.

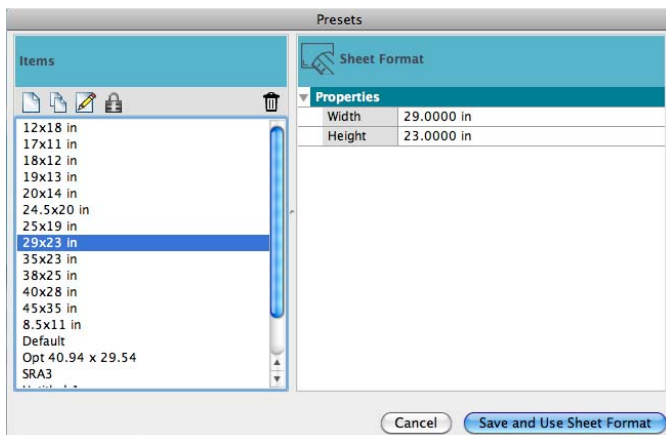
Click **Next** to exit the Wizard and preview the layout.

Creating Presets



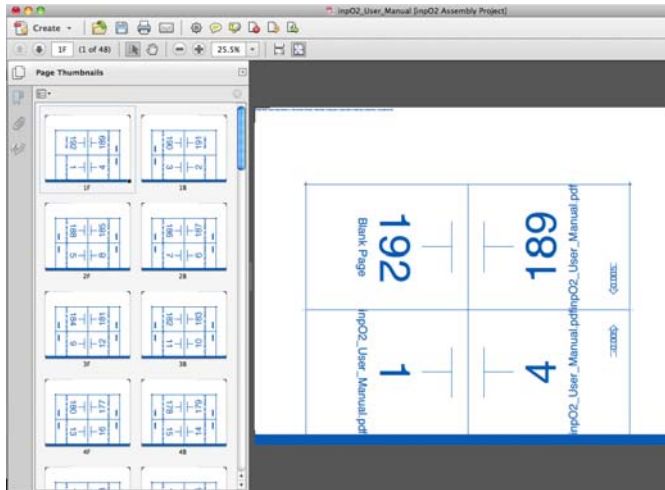
During the course of the exercise, you came across different drop lists offering presets, such as Sheet Format, mark options, etc.

On the right side of most drop lists, there is a “...” button that you can click to create new presets that fit your usual production requirements.



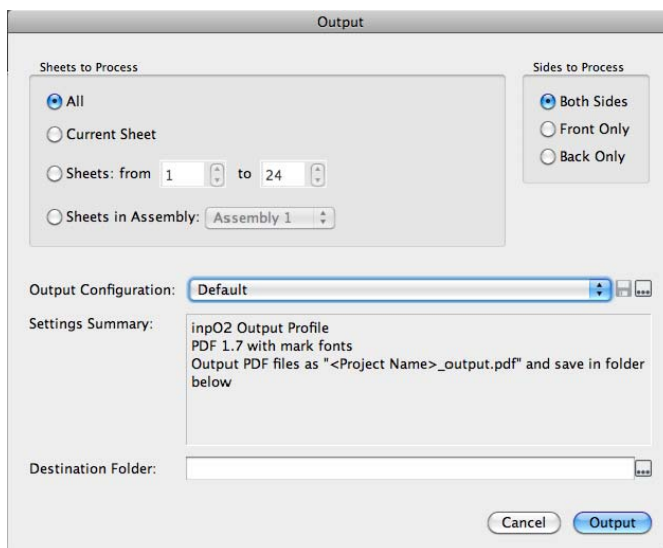
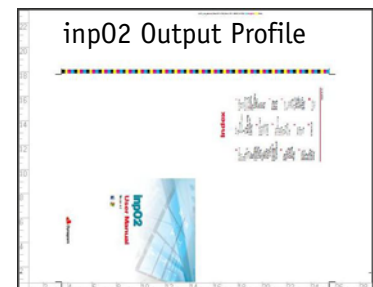
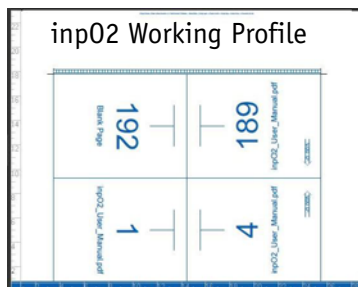
These **Presets** can be copied, renamed and deleted. They can also be locked to avoid being edited or deleted accidentally.

Preview and Output



Preview After the Wizard steps are completed, you can use Acrobat to preview the resulting layout. Open Acrobat's "Pages" navigation panel in the upper-left corner to see thumbnails of the signatures and navigate. By default, the imposition is displayed with the **inp02 Working Profile** showing only the layout without document pages.

Click on the **Profile** button in the toolbar and select **inp02 Proofing Profile** in the drop menu to display the page contents within the layout. Now choose the **inp02 Output Profile** to preview the printed sheet without the page boxes.



Output At this point, the job can be printed. Click on the **Output** button in the toolbar to open the dialogue.

Select **All Sheets** and **Both Sides**. In the Output Configuration drop list, select the **Default** settings.

In the lower-right corner of the window, click on the "..." button, browse and choose a destination folder, such as your RIP input folder.

Finally, click on the **Output** button. Your PDF imposition is now ready for the platesetter or digital printer.

Remember: If you are working with the **Demo version**, the output function is disabled.
