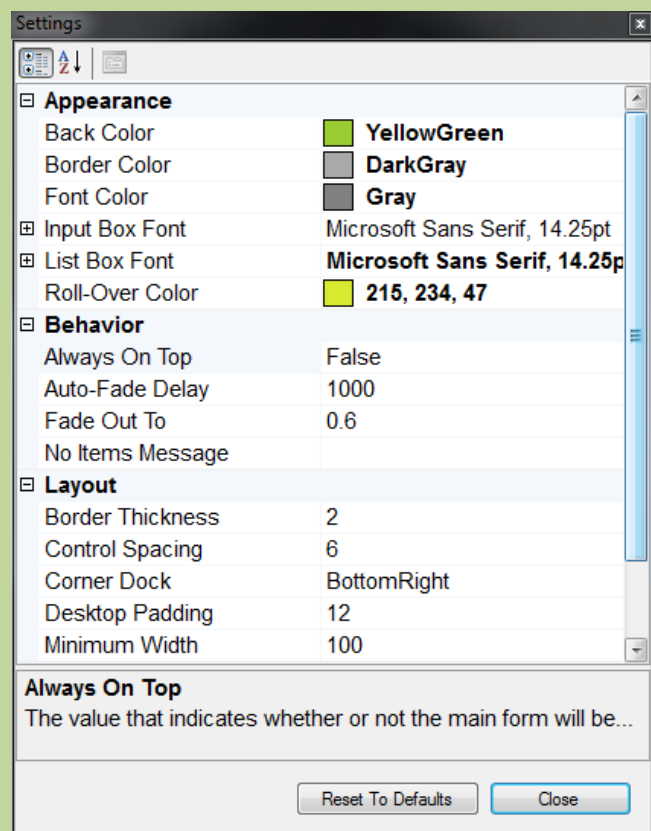

# About To Do Enhanced

To Do Enhanced is a desktop application that sits in one of the corners of your screen and holds a list (usually of things to do). It's definitely a good thing to jot thoughts down, so you don't forget them. If you're like me, you always have a huge list of tasks to keep track of on the computer. With To Do Enhanced you can easily add and delete these tasks appropriately. I think it makes a great programmer's assistant.

You can customize TDE to your likings, using the settings window. You may want it to match your desktop colors or fade in a different manner. This app is meant to stay out of the way but still be informative of current tasks. The app will auto size according to the text in the list box. It will also fade out to an optional opacity value when inactive. The app is built to be highly customizable.

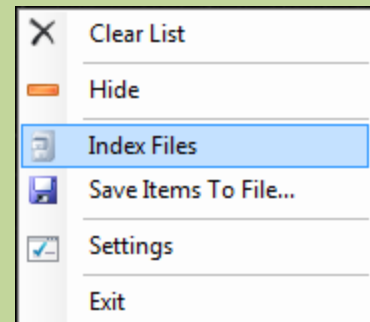


# Shortcut Keys

Enter	Submits text from the text box to the list box. (The text box must have focus)
Delete	Deletes any selected list items.
Print Screen	Hides the app and takes a screenshot of the entire screen. Then the app shows again. The screenshots are appended to the “My Pictures” folder. If that fails then they are saved to the applications startup path.
Ctrl + C	Copies the first selected list item’s text to clipboard.
Ctrl + T	Submits a time stamp to the list box.
Ctrl + A	Selects all items in the list box.
Ctrl + D	Deselects all items in the list box.
Ctrl+1	Dock top-left
Ctrl+2	Dock top-right
Ctrl+3	Dock bottom-right
Ctrl+4	Dock bottom-left

# The File Indexer

If you right click the anywhere in the window, you will see an item called “Index Files”. This function will index all of your bootable files that sit in your programs or system directory; So that you can find them quickly with the program. Just type in “Run”,



then part or all of the files name. The program will do its best to find and run the bootable file. Its particularly handy for booting up those small programs in the system root. If you use this feature, make sure to index your files every once and a while.

## Other Things...

1. Double click on an item to edit it. This will remove the item from the list and copy its text to the input box so you can change it.
2. I did not bother to add support for multiple displays because if you have the window in a non-primary display, it will be too easy for you to overlook your tasks.
