(utility for manipulating/editing HTML containing ad codes for banner exchanges and search engines)

What is this program useful for?

This product is ideal for updating a large number of html pages with the same block of code to be pasted in, such as with advertisement code from banner exchanges and search engines that pay you for displaying and/or getting clicks on their banners/boxes. In a matter of minutes, this program can do the work of a human over an hour or more.

Why should I want to use it?

To save yourself time when you need dozens or even hundreds of html pages updated, where the old code must be removed and replaced with a newer version of html code.

Do I have to Register to Use This Product?

You may use this product for free for 30 days. After that, you are expected to register it with the author. If you do not wish to register it, you should stop using this product.

Is this product Freeware?

No, this is not Freeware, but instead commercial software priced very affordable. Please consider registering this product for \$4.95 if you find it useful, and to encourage improvements and the frequency of newer versions. Remember, pay once for this product, and get lifetime updates for this product line at no additional fee.

What do the different buttons do when clicked on?

“Read Source” is for confirming that you have a valid path, not filename, to its immediate right. If you do not have a path, the program will not process your request until you do.

“Verify Source” will check the file path name to see that it is valid. If it is, it will count the number of files and display this information within the box to its right. If nothing happens when you click here,

you will need to change the “Read Source” file path to something valid and that points to one or more html (or htm) files.

“Send Modified” is where you want the processed data sent to and stored. You will want to use a directory here, but leave off the trailing ‘\’ symbol. Your “Read Source” and “Send Modified” should NEVER be the same folder.

“Define Markers” will tell the program what you want to trigger and release the splicing, or removal, of old code and the insertion of the new in its place.

“Define Fill-In” is what code you want to replace the code that was between the “Define Markers” tags. This box may be copy and pasted using Windows, but keep in mind you may need to copy and paste more than once in the instance of code sets that exceed one line in length. Alternatively, you may type and edit the code in this box manually simply by typing on the keypad.

“Exit” will return you to Windows OS and end your session with Update Slate.

“Process Now” will begin using all the data provided to the program, and will show “Success!” in the window directly above the button when the program has completed your request. You may then close the program or run the next set.

“Save Settings” will store all the data on the screen into a disk file for later recall. You may only save one session details at any given time, but you may change or update the data recall anytime you wish.

“Load Settings” will retrieve the data from the last “Save Sessions” and place it into the screen. It is your responsibility to click the buttons from top left to lower left with each set.

If you want to process only a certain number of files, you may type a non-zero number in the box to the right of the “Process Now” button but one window up from the bottom. If you put “16” here, without quotation, you will get up to 16 files processed when you later click “Process Now” button. If you type “0” or leave blank, then ALL the files available in the folder given to the right of “Read Source” will be processed.

Note that the window second from the top, to the right of “verify source” is a display-only window, meaning you can type whatever you want, but it will have absolutely no effect on operation of this program.

How do I update HTML step-by-step with this product?

Using the details above, fill in the appropriate details, then click top left, going down to just before the “Exit”, at which time you click “Process Now” to start.
