





1. Introduction

xAccounts is a Windows application that will help the user manage and organize various types of accounts (bank accounts, Facebook accounts, YouTube accounts, e-mail accounts...). It's never a good idea to share the same password or even the same username across many accounts. So xAccounts comes with eDice, which lets you create random passwords quickly. There are no limitations as to how many categories and accounts you can create.





2. Installing xAccounts


Double-click on **setup.exe** in the delivery package initiate the installation process. If your computer doesn't have it yet, xAccounts will first attempt to install **.NET Framework 4**, and you will be prompted for confirmation. (See Screenshot 2.) Then you will proceed to install xAccounts. You can use **Setup.msi** to install the application as long as you already have **.NET Framework 4**, which xAccounts requires. You can find the application at the following path: C:\Program Files\MacHouse\xAccounts.

3. Uninstalling xAccounts


Open Control Panel and choose Uninstall a program. Then double-click on xAccounts to initiate the uninstalling process. (See Screenshot 3.) You can also use the original setup.exe or setup.msi to uninstall the application. (See Screenshot 4.) Additionally, when it starts up for the first time, the application will create a folder, which you need to manually trash. You can locate it easily by opening Preferences and navigate to the System tab.
